Subpart D & AMCs	A description of the requirements regarding maintenance standards applicable to owner, operators and Approved Maintenance Organisations (AMO).	
Subpart E & AMCs	A description of the requirements regarding serviceable and unserviceable components.	
Subpart F	A brief description of the requirements for an AMO maintaining non-commercial aircraft (except large aircraft) and the components fitted to them. PLEASE CONTACT US IF YOU NEED A MORE IN-DEPTH COURSE COVERING SUBPART F.	
Subpart G, AMCs and Appendices to AMCs	A description of what is required to become either an AOC CAMO or a "standalone" CAMO and the differences in levels responsibility assigned to each. This section also covers the Airworthiness Review.	
Subpart H, AMCs & Appendices	A description of the Certificate of Release to Service (CRS) and by whom and under what circumstances it can be issued.	
Subpart I & AMCs	A description of the Airworthiness Review Certificate, its issue and the concept of the Controlled Environment.
