Part M One-Day Overview		
<p>These courses is designed for those not directly involved in Continuing Airworthiness tasks but are required to have a general knowledge of Annexe I of the Implementing Rule (in other words, Part M). It would also help those in Part 145 or Subpart F environments understand what their customers or operators are required to do.</p> <p>The course is a high-level overview that runs from M.A.101 to M.A 905 and describes each subpart to provide a general knowledge. This course does not delve into Acceptable Means of Compliance other than by reference. The course touches briefly on Subpart F covering maintenance of non-commercial and/or non-large aircraft (please contact us if you need a more in-depth Subpart F course).</p>

Subpart D	A description of the requirements regarding maintenance standards applicable to owner, operators and Approved Maintenance Organisations (AMO).	
Subpart E	A description of the requirements regarding serviceable and unserviceable components.	
Subpart F	A brief description of the requirements for an AMO maintaining non-commercial aircraft (except large aircraft) and the components fitted to them. PLEASE CONTACT US IF YOU NEED A MORE IN-DEPTH COURSE COVERING SUBPART F.	
Subpart G	A description of what is required to become either an AOC CAMO or a “standalone” CAMO and the differences in levels responsibility assigned to each. This section also covers the Airworthiness Review.	
Subpart H	A description of the Certificate of Release to Service (CRS) and by whom and under what circumstances it can be issued.	
Subpart I	A description of the Airworthiness Review Certificate, its issue and the concept of the Controlled Environment.
